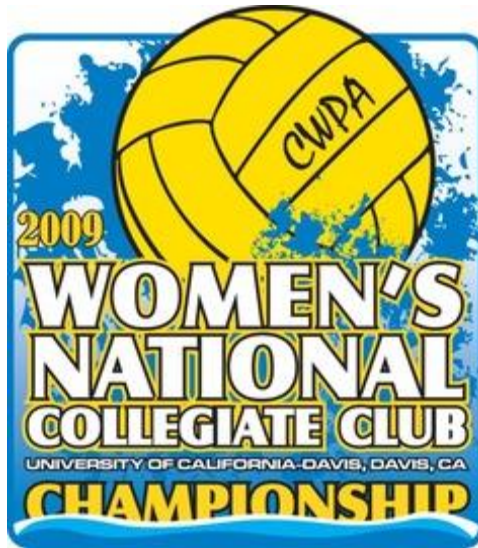

The tournament is not seeded by ability, since there is no equitable means to determine the respective strength of the teams. A few teams play outside of their division schedules to be able to create an accurate seeding. Match-ups are therefore based upon 2008 National Collegiate Club Championship results by division. The Host region receives two automatic bids, one of which is assigned by the division champion and the other by the host site or division runner-up (the 16th position). This ensures the tournament is always a participant.

The teams are seed based on a policy voted in during the 2008 Annual Meeting. The seeding rule states: *The top eight division winners will be seeded according to their division's finish the prior season. Places nine and ten will be reserved for the top two division runner-ups in order of their division's finish. The remaining places will be filled with the divisions according to their division's finish the prior season, with random draws used to break ties in placing.*

This year the University of Washington declined their bid as the runner-up from the Northwest Division. Consequently the bid went to the next highest division based on the finish at last year's event (Sierra Pacific Division). However, league rules prohibit a division from having more than two teams represented. Since the Sierra Pacific Division is hosting the championship in 2008 and already receive two bids. Therefore the open bid will be awarded to the next highest finishing division, which in this case is the Southwest Division.

Teams listed first wear dark caps and are home on the scoreboard. Host team always wears dark caps and is listed first on the scoreboard regardless of seed.
