

New England Division

Meeting held March 24, 2015 4:00 p.m.

Attending: Dan Sharadin, Commissioner; Katie Wieber, Dir. The Commissioner opened the call with an overview of the National Championship ballot, explaining that some teams throughout the country begin school late September or early October, leaving them with a 15-day season. To address this issue the CWPA is asking teams to vote on an alternate date for the National Championship that would extend their seasons.

The division schedule was the next item on the agenda. Teams were unable to confirm exactly when they can host, but some tentative dates and locations were listed as follows:

- September 19-20 or 26-27 - Boston University
- October 10-11 - Wesleyan University
- October 24-25 - Championship at Middlebury College if Nationals are in November
- November 7-8 - Championship at Middlebury College if Nationals are in December

Connecticut was unsure about hosting and will forward their administrator's info to the CWPA office so they can talk to the staff directly.

Wesleyan will discuss the issue of switching to the North Atlantic Division with their team, in order to finish earlier in the year due to the large number of swimmers on their team. The North Atlantic Division is comprised primarily of Division III teams.

Hosts were reminded to complete the Pool Reservation Form, found under the Forms section on the website. Hotels will be reserved once these forms are submitted.

The Commissioner mentioned that all necessary forms for Team Leaders are found on the website under the Forms Tab. This includes the Participation Agreement that needs to be submitted by the Club Supervisor before June 1st. Likewise, Team Leaders need to turn in their Media Guide Info using the form on the website by the fall. Emails for players should be included so athletes can be notified when games within the division will be streamed.

All coaches were urged to complete an Evaluation Form about the officials following each of the competitions. This form is found under the Forms tab of the website.

Teams were encouraged to send in pictures or story leads to promote their programs and enhance the interest of the website. Likewise, Team Leaders should take advantage of the Player of the Week program and nominate athletes each week, whether the games are within the league or non-conference.

The Commissioner mentioned the streaming program will feature a play-by-play announcer this season to enhance the broadcast. Efforts will be made to stream every division at least once during the season.

A new fundraising program was outlined by Katie Wieber, Dir. of Membership Services. The program permits teams to upload a design online and have people purchase shirts. All work is performed by the online store and teams can make \$500 for selling 50 shirts.

The Commissioner mentioned the requirement for Team Leaders to review the Team Orientation webinars. The program consists of three webinars and can be accessed via the Membership Page. There is also an optional fundraising webinar that provides some great tips.
