The conference call opened with a discussion about the lack of competitive equity and how it harms the experience for teams with lopsided scores and multiple forfeits. To resolve this issue there needs to be a revision in the scheduling that increases the number of times similar programs compete against each other.

With the Sierra Pacific Division spanning such a large geographic footprint, merging with another division is not practical, so any effort along these lines will need to be made internally.

The call discussed all three schedule options (listed below) and the postseason championships: Teams like the idea of the Hybrid where everyone plays everyone but split into A/B Championship. Teams also liked the idea of the National Invite.

No one had any dates they could confirm to host as of the call, but several indicated interest. Teams were asked to find out from the Aquatics Director which dates were available and the email office@collegiatewaterpolo.org within the next few weeks.

Cal Merced asked about the participation contact being due June 1st and the CWPA has asked that if you intend to play, submit the form and if something changes, notify the office later. The CWPA will be flexible. All teams on the call stated they are tentative as of today.

UC Davis stated they will likely only have one roster (no "B" team because of numbers).

Call ended with letting the leadership know there have been several changes in office staff but the CWPA continues to be there to serve them and create the best experience possible. They were asked to reach out to the office with questions or concerns and were thanked for their participation.

The next conference call to confirm the competitive structure. Teams need to discuss the options presented here and be ready to make a decision during the next call.

Option 1 Status Quo

Teams play within their division for the two regular season tournaments and then attend an "A" or "B" division championship based on their won/loss records within their division. Regular season match-ups are weighted according to past history.

Note, there are variations available for Option 1 that create regular season matchups based on historical data from the year prior. These are listed below for consideration.

Option 1A Teams are divided into three groups: 1-3, 4-6, 7-10. Each group plays those in their group twice then the next closest group once, with the balance of the remaining games drawn sequentially.

Advantages-teams will play most of their games against opponents that are close in ability. Disadvantages- teams will play their "B" teams

Option 1B – Teams are divided so that 1-3 never play 7-10. This will reduce the chance that teams will play their B teams

Option 1C - Split into two brackets according to finish in the standings from prior year

Top five play double round robin in regular season followed by a championship
Bottom five play double round robin in regular season followed by a championship
Each championship winner moves on to their respective National Championship
The following year the worst team in the top five drops to the bottom bracket and the best
team from the bottom moves to the top or they have the option to decline to move

Option 2 Hybrid

Teams play within their division during the first two weekends to determine standings. The top half of the teams from one division will play against the top half of the division from the neighboring division at the "A" Championship and the bottom half of the teams from each division will do the same at the "B" Championship.

Option 3 Self -Selection

Teams decide before the season begins whether they want to compete in the "A" bracket or the "B" bracket. The advantage means you would be playing against comparable programs from the beginning of the season as opposed to waiting until the championship, but it could mean longer travel distances.

The second conference call opened with a brief recap of the competitive format options discussed a week prior. The purpose of this call was to select which competitive option would be used this fall.
