There is no standard COVID protocol, each school seems to be developing their own policies for athletic competition with or without spectators. The Naval academy is requiring all officials to be vaccinated. Brown is requiring everyone to wear masks indoors regardless of vaccination status but not requiring a mask of officials when working, only between periods. Presenting a negative PCR test at least 72 hours before arriving on campus is a possibility. I will do the best I can to communicate each school's protocols before game contests or weekends.

## Register for Arbiter: NCAA Water Polo Officiating ADVANTAGE

If you are planning to officiate varsity games in 2021, you need to register for Arbiter and successfully pass the NCAA Rules Test (90%). Unfortunately, CWPA will not be able to cover this cost. The CWPA is in a financial hardship with the loss of two seasons depleting all resources.
