Understanding the Game of Water Polo

Water Polo can be a confusing game for spectators. The whistle is constantly blowing and the play never stops, even when someone is ejected for a penalty. In addition, there are many misconceptions about the game, including how the players keep their horses swimming. The following information is here to make your game-viewing experience a little bit clearer!

General Information

- 1. Each team has six field players and a goalie.
- 2. Field players can only use one hand to touch the ball, goalies two.
- 3. The game consists of four quarters and the clock stops on the whistle. If the game is tied at the end of regulation, the teams play two three-minute overtime periods. If it is still tied, the game goes into sudden victory. A typical game lasts about an hour and ten minutes.
- 4. The object of the game is to score by placing the ball completely in the goal. Players may move the ball by swimming or passing.
- 5. Teams may substitute after a goal is scored, during a time-out, or during the play from the ejection area.
- 6. Each team receives three time-outs and one 30-second time-out per game.
- 7. Shots blocked out of bounds by defensive players result in the defensive team receiving possession. If a defender uses two hands to block a shot, the offensive team receives a penalty shot.

Types of Fouls

When an infraction of the rules occurs, the referee will point in the direction of the team taking possession, while blowing his whistle. The ball is put back into play with an action called a free throw. This means the player gets three seconds of free time to throw the ball to another teammate or swim it up the pool. A player cannot shoot his free throw unless outside the five-meter line. If the ball is not put into play within three seconds, the other team takes possession.

Fouls can be ordinary or major. Ordinary fouls are best understood as minor fouls. For example, a defender may reach over an opponent's back to get at the ball while facing away from the goal. The penalty for an ordinary foul is a free throw for the opposing team.

Major fouls are more severe and are penalized accordingly. For example, when a defender fouls an opponent too aggressively, or from behind when the opponent is facing the goal, the defender is ejected for 20 seconds (players may reenter if their team recovers the ball before the ejection time is up, or if the opposing team scores). When the foul occurs within five meters of the goal and the referee believes the player had a high chance of scoring, the opposition shoots a penalty shot. Major fouls can also occur through disrespect to the referee or when a player interferes with an opponent's free throw. Players may only receive three major fouls before elimination.

The easiest way to follow the play is by watching the scoreboard. If your team is ahead at the end, great! If not, well consider that you have expanded your horizons. When the game is over, you can at least explain to your friends that the horses never get wet.

McKendree University (11-8 L)...The Golden Knights are 7-2 overall against the rest of the MAWPC-West field as Gannon downed McKendree (15-10 W) and fell to Salem (11-10 L) in non-conference action during the regular season prior to clipping McKendree (13-11 W), Mercyhurst (14-9 W) and Salem (14-9 W) on October 23-24 for the Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA) Division II Eastern Championship...Gannon is aiming for the program's third MAWPC-West crown after turning back Mercyhurst (12-6 W) and McKendree (15-14 W OT) at the Hallman Aquatics Center as the host institution in 2019. The prior time Gannon hosted at Hallman in 2017, the team claimed the title by cutting through the championship field with victories over Washington & Jefferson (17-2 W) and former varsity program La Salle University (12-9 W) prior to defeating Mercyhurst (15-10 W) for the program's first conference title...Since the formation of the MAWPC-West, the Golden Knights have finished first (2019, 2017), second (Winter 2021) and third (2018, 2016). Earlier this year in championship hosted by Mercyhurst at the Hallman Aquatic Center in Erie, the Golden Knights stopped Salem (7-6 W) and former MAWPC-West/current MAWPC-East member Mount St. Mary's University (16-9 W) to reach the title tilt. Facing McKendree for the title, Gannon dropped a 21-8 game on February 28...Historically, the regular season runner-up has never won the MAWPC-West Championship as Mercyhurst (2016) and McKendree (2018) were the No. 4 seeds, while Gannon (2017, 2019) and McKendree (Winter 2021) held the No. 1 spot during their title years.

MAWPC-West Championships...The first exception is 2018 when Salem managed Mercyhurst (13-12 L) in the semifinals to set-up a 13-12 defeat of the Tigers by McKendree University in the title tilt...The other exception came during the Winter 2021 season as McKendree stormed through the field to take the most recent title...Salem had never finished outside the Top Four at the MAWPC -Championship prior to earning Fifth Place with a 25-24 defeat of Washington & Jefferson College at the Winter 2021 tournament...In 2019, the Tigers topped W&J (22-8 W) before falling to McKendree (16-15 L OT SD) and tripping Mercyhurst (16-9 W) in the Third Place game...In 2018, the team defeated Monmouth College (25-10 W) and Mercyhurst (13-12 W) before taking a 13-12 loss to McKendree in the championship game...In 2017, the Tigers defeated McKendree (14-10 W) to make the tournament semifinals. However, Mercyhurst edged Salem by a 17-16 score in sudden death overtime prior to the Tigers taking a 16-13 victory against former varsity team La Salle University in the Third Place game...Salem placed Fourth at the inaugural/2016 MAWPC-West Championship as the team defeated Monmouth (18-15 W) prior to falling to Connecticut College (19-15 L) and Gannon (14-7 L)...Salem's first and only championship in men's water polo came in 2004 as the Tigers topped Mercyhurst in the Division II Eastern Championship...The 2005, 2016, 2017, 2018 and 2019 Division II Eastern Championship runner-up, the Tigers will strive to give head coach Rob Bullion his first title and join Mercyhurst, Gannon and McKendree among the Division II schools which have claimed the MAWPC-West Championship...Salem finished 2-2 in MAWPC-West play this Fall in games versus Gannon (18-15 L), Mercyhurst (17-9 W), W&J (16-9 W) and McKendree (14-6 L)...Overall, the team finished 6-3 against the rest of the field with non-conference wins over Mercyhurst (14-11 W) and Gannon (11-10 W) to go along with Division II Eastern matchups versus Mercyhurst (18-14 W), McKendree (12-10 W) and Gannon (14-9 L) as the Tigers finished in Second Place at the event.

(MAWPC)-West Championship as the Presidents fell to eventual champion McKendree University (26-9 L), Mercyhurst University (17-12 L) and Salem University (25-24 L)...In 2019, the team placed fifth as W&J dropped a contest to Salem (22-8 L) prior to defeating both Monmouth College (8-7 W) and Connecticut College (9-8 W)...In 2018, W&J placed sixth with a loss to eventual champion McKendree (18-8 L), a win over Monmouth (21-9 W) and a 14-13 setback in overtime against Connecticut...The team took Eighth Place in an eight-team field at the 2017 MAWPC-West Championship as the Presidents fell to eventual champion Gannon University (17-2 L), Connecticut (19-10 L) and Monmouth (14-12 L)...In 2016, W&J finished in Fifth Place by falling to eventual champion Mercyhurst (12-9 L) prior to defeating Monmouth (19-7 W) and La Salle University (23-6 W) in a seven-team field...Washington & Jefferson faced the rest of the field only once this year as the Presidents fell to McKendree (20-5 L), Gannon (14-8 L) and Salem (16-9 L) with a victory over Mercyhurst (10-9 W)...This weekend marks the second time in 2021 the Presidents will compete in West Virginia after previously falling to McKendree (24-6 L) and Mount St. Mary's University (17-10 L) on February 13...Entering the weekend with a 9-10 record, the Presidents have a chance to make history and record either their first .500 or winning season since at least 2005 (9-10) as yearly records for W&J are not available before 2005.

History of the Collegiate Water Polo Association

The Collegiate Water Polo Association originally began as the Mid Atlantic Conference, founded by Dick Russell (Bucknell University swimming & water polo coach) in the 1970's. Its founding membership included teams from Maryland, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and New York.

The leadership and management of the organization relied on volunteer coaches until 1990, when it hired a commissioner to perform basic scheduling for the 15 member teams. Officiating assignments at the time were performed by an independent organization called the Eastern Water Polo Referees Association (EWPRA).

The next major milepost occurred in 1993, when the Southern and New England Conferences merged into the Mid Atlantic. The new structure combined all of the varsity teams in the East, along with the few sport clubs in existence at that time.

During the 1995 season, the conference received its first major challenge, as the organization experienced a strike by its officiating core. This strike ultimately resulted in the organization establishing its own officiating bureau, assuming responsibility for all of its officiating assignments.

The CWPA's office is located in Bridgeport, Pennsylvania and the league staff is comprised of Commissioner Dan Sharadin, Director of Communications Ed Haas, Director of Multimedia Justin Cypert and Coordinator of Officials Ed Reed.

The staff oversees 290+ teams on the varsity and club level for both men and women to place the Collegiate Water Polo Association among the largest sports organizations in North America.
