

Wagner College (16-12, 10-6 MAWPC), which fell to George Washington University by an 8-5 score in the 2017 Mid-Atlantic Water Polo Conference (MAWPC) Championship title game at the United States Naval Academy, will aim to take the league championship crown back to the Spiro Sports Center in Staten Island...The Seahawks has prior meetings against Bucknell University (11-9 L, 11-5 L), Fordham University (12-11 L, 14-9 L), Gannon University (17-8 W), George Washington (15-10 L, 11-8 L), Johns Hopkins University (17-6 W, 16-12 W), McKendree University (14-9 W, 16-9 W), Mercyhurst University (19-6 W), Mount St. Mary's University (20-13 W, 13-12 W), Salem University (18-14 W, 21-16 W) and the United States Naval Academy (15-14 W, 13-11 W) this year...Wagner has never finished outside the Top Five at the MAWPC Championship with prior Second (2017), Third (2018), Fourth (2021) and Fifth

(2016,2019) place marks...At the 2016 MAWPC Championship, Wagner fell to Fordham (9-7 L) prior to taking care of Connecticut College (18-6 W) and Navy (16-13 W) to earn a Fifth Place mark...In 2017, the Seahawks downed Navy (9-8 W) and Bucknell (10-8 W) before dropping an 8-5 game to George Washington to garner a runner-up finish...12 months later at Fordham, Wagner defeated Johns Hopkins (9-7 L) and slipped against George Washington (16-14 L) prior to taking out the host Rams (10-6 W) in the Third Place game...In 2019 at Bucknell, Wagner suffered a 16-12 setback versus Navy prior to topping La Salle University (15-13 W) and Johns Hopkins (14-11 W) to claim Fifth Place...Following a Winter 2021 season in which the team did not compete for the title due to COVID restrictions, Wagner downed Bucknell (8-7 W) before faltering in overtime to host Fordham (11-10 L OT) and dropping an 11-9 contest in regulation to place Fourth at the 2021 MAWPC tournament...A New York based institutions has not won a men's water polo in varsity competition since St. Francis College Brooklyn picked up the 2012 and 2013 crowns prior to the division of the Collegiate Water Polo Association into the MAWPC and Northeast Water Polo Conference.

in a non-conference game (8-7 W) at home in Lewisburg on September 18 to stand at 11-6 against the league overall...Bucknell claimed the 2016 MAWPC title via an 11-5 final score at Kinney Natatorium on November 20...The title marked the program's first conference championship since taking home the 1980 Eastern Championship against Loyola University...Following a 12-11 overtime loss to George Washington in the 2018 title game at Fordham, the Bison won another MAWPC crown in 2019 on November 18 by dispatching George Washington via a 9-4 score at home in Lewisburg...During the Winter of 2021, Bucknell topped La Salle University by an 11-3 score on March 7 to claim the 2020/Winter 2021 MAWPC title in Lewisburg...In 2017 at Navy, the team downed Mercyhurst (15-4 W), fell to Wagner (10-8 L) and turned back Fordham (10-9 W) to claim Third Place...Most recently, the Bison dropped an 8-7 contest versus Wagner, upended Mount St. Mary's (17-11 W) and turned back Gannon (9-7 W) to take Fifth Place at the 2021 MAWPC Championship hosted by Navy...Since the 1980 title tilt, Bucknell has appeared in five championship games as the Bison competed for a league crown in 1985 (vs. Brown University), 1993 (vs. the University of Massachusetts), 2012 (vs. St. Francis College Brooklyn), 2016 (vs. George Washington), 2018 (vs. George Washington), 2019 (vs. George Washington) and 2020/21 (vs. La Salle)...Bucknell is slated to serve as the host site for the 2023 MAWPC Championship as the event is penciled in to occur at Bucknell (2023, 2026, 2029), Navy (2024, 2027) and Fordham (2025, 2028) over the remainder of the decade.



The three-time (2016, 2019, 2020/Winter 2021) Mid-Atlantic Water Polo Conference (MAWPC) Champion, 2017 Third Place finisher, 2018 runner-up, the Bison of Bucknell University (14-14, 10-6 MAWPC) are coming off a Fifth Place mark at the 2021 MAWPC Championship...This year, the Bison went .500 in league play against Fordham University (10-7 L, 13-12 L), Gannon University (18-13 W), George Washington University (11-9 L, 12-11 L), Johns Hopkins University (15-7 W, 18-4 W), McKendree University (12-3 W), Mercyhurst University (23-5 W), Mount St. Mary's University (12-8 W, 22-10 W), Salem University (15-8 W), the United States Naval Academy (10-9 L, 8-6 L) and Wagner College (11-9 W, 11-5 W)...The Bison also faced McKendree

The Midshipmen of the United States Naval Academy (13-14, 8-8 MAWPC) enter the league championship with hopes of returning to the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Championship for the first time since 2008...A nine-time league champion (1986, 1987, 1988, 1990, 2000, 2003, 2006, 2007, 2008) and eight-time runner-up (1984, 1991, 1994, 2002, 2005, 2009, 2010, 2011), Navy previously finished Second (2021 at home), Third (2019 at Bucknell University), Fifth (2017 at home) and Sixth (2016 at Bucknell, 2018 at Fordham University) in five prior tries at the MAWPC title...Last year under current head coach Luis Nicolao, the Mids defeated Gannon University (20-13 W) and George Washington University (11-7 W) before falling to Fordham (9-6 L) to finish in Second Place...Against the rest of the MAWPC this year, Navy faced Bucknell (10-9 W OT, 8-6 W), Fordham (14-7 L, 11-5 L), Gannon (15-12 OT W), George Washington (14-12 L, 12-11 OT L), Johns Hopkins University (15-11 W,

Hallman III Aquatics Center to capture the 2022 Division II Eastern crown...This year, Salem took on Bucknell University (15-8 L), Fordham University (17-14 L), Gannon (18-16 W), George Washington University (23-9 L), Johns Hopkins University (18-15 W), McKendree (23-14 L), Mercyhurst (24-13 W), Mount St. Mary's University (20-9 W), the United States Naval Academy (14-13 W) and Wagner College (21-16 L) in league action. Further, the team played non-conference contests versus Fordham (24-12 L), Mercyhurst (21-12 W), Mount St. Mary's (18-16 W), George Washington (23-6 L), Wagner (18-14 L) and Johns Hopkins (18-17 L) and the Tigers' trio of Division II Eastern Championship games versus Gannon, Mercyhurst and McKendree to hold a 10-9 mark against MAWPC foes.

Salem University (14-12, 5-5 MAWPC) comes into the program's inaugural Mid-Atlantic Water Polo Conference (MAWPC) Championship with high expectations of joining two-time (1997, 2002) winner/former varsity program Queens College (N.Y.) as the only Division II programs to capture a Collegiate Water Polo Association (C W P A) / M A W P C / Northeast Water Polo Conference (NWPC) title...Salem's first championship in men's water polo came in 2004 as the Tigers topped Mercyhurst University in the Division II Eastern Championship...The Tigers gave head coach Rob Bullion his first title earlier this season as the team downed McKendree University (17-15 W), Mercyhurst University (22-3 W) and Gannon University



The defending Mid-Atlantic Water Polo Conference Champion, the Rams of Fordham University (23-7, 16-0 MAWPC) claimed the first conference championship in the history of the program last year at the United States Naval Academy by managing Mount St. Mary's University (20-6 W), Wagner College (11-10 W OT) and the host Midshipmen (9-6 W)...This year, the Rams defeated Bucknell University (10-7 W, 13-12 W), Gannon University (18-9 W), George Washington University (16-7 W, 14-13 W), Johns Hopkins University (23-9 W, 19-11 W), McKendree University (25-3 W), Mercyhurst University (23-2 W), Mount St. Mary's (17-13 W, 23-7 W), Salem University (17-14 W), the United States Naval Academy (14-7 W, 11-5 W) and Wagner (12-11 W, 14-9 W). Fordham also faced both Gannon University (28-8 W) and Salem University (24-12 W) in non-league games as the team posted an 18-0 mark against the field in 2022...This marks the 10th time since 1987 that the Rams have competed in a league championship tournament as the team placed Fifth (2009 at the Massachusetts Institute of Technology), Eighth (2010 at Bucknell), 11th (2013 at Brown University) and Ninth (2014 at Navy; 2015 at MIT) at the Eastern/Collegiate Water

George Washington University (10-7 L) and Johns Hopkins (12-11 L) before topping Mercyhurst University (13-12 W OT SD)...This year, the Gannon faced Bucknell (18-13 L), Fordham (28-8 L), George Washington (19-10 L), Johns Hopkins (20-19 W), Mercyhurst University (8-2 W), McKendree University (14-10 L), Mount St. Mary's University (24-21 L), Navy (15-12 L OT), Salem University (18-16 L) and Wagner College (17-8 L). In addition, the Golden Knights faced Mercyhurst (16-8 W), McKendree (13-12 W) and Salem (13-12 L) on October 21-23 at the Division II Eastern Championship as the team holds a 4-9 overall mark against the MAWPC Championship field...No East Coast men's team west of Lewisburg has won an Eastern/Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA)/MAWPC or Northeast Water Polo Conference (NWPC) league championship title and/or automatic berth to the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Championship since Slippery Rock University took home a title in 1991 against Navy...A Division II school has not appeared in either a Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA), MAWPC or Northeast Water Polo Conference (NWPC) Championship title game since former varsity program Queens College (N.Y.) downed the United States Naval Academy in 2001.



Gannon University (8-15, 2-8 MAWPC) returns to the Mid-Atlantic Water Polo Conference (MAWPC) Championship after placing Sixth last year as the MAWPC-West Region Champion...In 2021 at the United States Naval Academy, the Golden Knights fell to the host Midshipmen (20-13 L), defeated Johns Hopkins University (13-9 W) and dropped a 9-7 contest versus Bucknell University...In 2019 at Bucknell University, the Golden Knights fell to Fordham University (16-11 L) and Johns Hopkins University (17-13 L) before downing La Salle University (15-9 W) to claim Seventh Place...In 2017 at Navy under then head coach Sean Morphy, the Golden Knights fell to Fordham (18-9 L),

The newest program in the league, Mount St. Mary's University (13-13, 6-10 MAWPC) makes the program's second appearance at the Mid-Atlantic Water Polo Conference (MAWPC) Championship following a 2020/Winter 2021 season in which the Mountaineers competed during an abbreviated regular, but did not play at the four-team MAWPC Championship...Last year at the United States Naval Academy, the Mountaineers qualified eighth in an eight-team field and faced Fordham University (20-6 L), Bucknell University (17-11 L) and Johns Hopkins University (9-7 L) to place Eighth...This year, Mount St. Mary's faced Bucknell University (12-8 L, 22-10 L), Fordham (17-13 L, 23-7 L), Gannon University (24-21 W), George Washington University (16-14 L, 13-12 L), Johns Hopkins (16-12 W, 21-12 W), McKendree University (22-12 W), Mercyhurst University (18-8 W), Navy (16-13 L, 15-14 W), Salem University (20-9 L) and Wagner College (20-13 L, 13-12 L) in league regular season competition. Further, the team competed in non-conference action versus McKendree (11-10 W), Mercyhurst (17-13 W) and Salem (18-16 L) as the squad is 8-11 against the Mountaineers' potential foes this weekend...Head coach Alyssa Diacono is believed to be the third woman to lead a men's team to a Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA)/MAWPC/Northeast Water Polo Conference (NWPC) championship tournament following CWPA Hall of Fame member/former Bucknell head coach Lynn Kachmarik and McKendree University head coach Colleen Lischwe...Mount St. Mary's assistant coach may have inside knowledge on Salem University as he worked under Salem head coach Rob Bullion as a graduate assistant for three semesters. During his tenure, he aided Bullion in helping the Tigers achieve a 12-12 mark during the Fall 2019 season...In the history of the league, only three teams from Pennsylvania have claimed CWPA/MAWPC/Northeast Water Polo Conference (NWPC) crowns as Bucknell and the University of Pittsburgh (1976) and Slippery Rock University (1991) achieved the feat since 1972.

In addition, Mercyhurst contested non-conference games versus Salem (21-12 L), Johns Hopkins (13-7 L), McKendree (21-12 L) and Mount St. Mary's (17-13 L) along with Division II Eastern Championship games against Gannon (16-8 L), Salem (23-6 L) and McKendree (13-6 L) as the team currently stands at 0-17 against MAWPC institutions in 2022.

The 2017 and 2018 Mid-Atlantic Water Polo Conference (MAWPC) Champion, George Washington University (21-6, 14-2 MAWPC) will aim to make the program's fifth MAWPC Championship title game appearance...In 2016, the Colonials fell to host Bucknell University by an 11-5 final in the title game of the inaugural MAWPC Championship...At the United States Naval Academy in 2017, GW got over the hump and claimed the league crown by rolling through the field with victories over Gannon University (10-7 W) and Fordham University (16-15 W OT) before upending Wagner College (8-5 W) for the inaugural crown in school history and the first under then first-year head coach Barry King...In 2018 at Fordham, the Colonials handled McKendree University (16-6 W), Wagner (16-14 W) and finally Bucknell (12-11 OT W) to put another banner in the team's natatorium...In 2019 at Bucknell, the Colonials lost the title game to the Bison by a 9-4 score...During the Winter 2021 season, GW dropped a 6-4 game to La Salle University in the opening game of the 2020/Winter 2021 MAWPC Championship...Last year at Navy, the team downed Johns Hopkins University (12-6 W), fell to the host Midshipmen (11-7 L) and posted an 11-9 defeat of Wagner in the Third Place game...This marks GW's 12th appearance at a league championship tournament since 2007...The squad finished in Seventh Place at the 2013 CWPA Championship hosted by Brown University prior to earning Eighth Place at the 2014 CWPA Championship hosted by Navy...The Colonials finished in 9th Place at the 2015 CWPA Championship hosted by the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT)...Earlier in the century, George Washington claimed Third Place at the 2007 CWPA Championship hosted by Harvard University after notching an Eighth Place

The 14-7 win over Mercyhurst and 18-17 defeat of Salem both occurred in non-conference competition...The Blue Jays have made a Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA)/MAWPC league championship title game only once—the 2015 CWPA Championship title tilt at MIT against Princeton University...The most successful Division III team on the East Coast with 20 Division III Eastern Championships (1994, 1995, 1996, 1998, 1999, 2001, 2002, 2004, 2005, 2006, 2008, 2009, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2017, 2019, 2021, 2022) and nine runner-up (1991, 1992, 1993, 1997, 2000, 2003, 2010, 2014, 2018) finishes, the Blue Jays dropped their only league title game berth by a 7-6 count against the Tigers to miss out on the institution's first league title and National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Championship berth in the sport of men's water polo...The runner-up finish was historic as the Blue Jays became the first and only Division III institution to make a league title game on the East Coast...Johns Hopkins will make the program's 18th try at a league championship after placing Second (2015), Fourth (2009), Sixth (2006, 2008, 2010, 2011, 2014), Seventh (2002, 2007), Eighth (2000, 2001) and Ninth (2013) at Collegiate Water Polo Association (CWPA) Championships before placing Fourth (2016), Fifth (2018), Sixth (2017, 2019) and Seventh (2021) at the MAWPC Championship...For the sake of clarity, the pre-2013 appearances occurred in eight-team fields, while the 2014 and 2015 tournaments were both 12-team events.



Johns Hopkins University (10-22, 2-14 MAWPC) enters the 2022 Mid-Atlantic Water Polo Conference (MAWPC) Championship with another postseason berth already locked up...The Division III Eastern Champion via a 12-11 defeat of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) on October 23 at the Hallman Aquatic Center in Erie, the Blue Jays punched their ticket to the four-team Division III Collegiate Water Polo National Championship sponsored by USA Water Polo on December 3-4 at an institutional site in the Southern California Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (SCIAC)...JHU faced Bucknell University (15-7 L, 18-4 L), Fordham University (23-9 L, 19-11 L), Gannon University (20-19 L), George Washington University (23-8 L, 16-11 L), McKendree University (12-11 W), Mer-

The Bearcats of McKendree University (6-17, 3-7 MAWPC) come into the league championship tournament following prior meetings against Bucknell University (12-3 L), Fordham University (25-3 L), Gannon University (14-10 W), George Washington University (17-7 L), Johns Hopkins University (12-11 L), Mercyhurst University (18-11 W), Mount St. Mary's University (21-12 L), Salem University (23-14 W), the United States Naval Academy (16-9 L) and Wagner College (16-9 L). In addition, the team played Salem (17-15 L), Gannon (13-12 L) and Mercyhurst (13-6 W) at the 2022 Division II Eastern Championship hosted at the Hallman Aquatics Center in Erie, while also competing in non-conference games versus Mercyhurst (21-12 W), Bucknell (8-7 L), Wagner (14-9 L) and Mount St. Mary's (11-10 L) to hold an overall mark of 4-13 in conference/

non-conference competition against the rest of the championship field...The 2018 and Winter 2021 MAWPC-West Champion to rate among three Division II teams to capture the MAWPC-West Region title joining Mercyhurst (2016) and Gannon (2017, 2019, 2021) prior to the elimination of the East and West Regions prior to this season, the team competed at the 2018 MAWPC Championship at Fordham.
