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# Federal Graduation Rate (FGR) Calculation

- The Division III cohort includes:
  - Nonscholarship freshmen.
  - Transfers into school.
  - Midyear enrollees.
- Must include even if the student-athlete quit the team at any point.
- Graduation status recorded six years after enrollment.
- Those who leave school in good academic standing are counted as nongraduates.



# Academic Success Rate (ASR) Calculation

- Graduation metric developed by NCAA.
- Calculated for student-athletes only.
- The Division III cohort includes:
  - Nonscholarship freshmen.
  - Transfers into school.
  - Midyear enrollees.
- Removes student-athletes who leave school while eligible to compete.
- Graduation status recorded six years after initial collegiate enrollment.



# Rate Calculations

$$\text{Federal} \left\{ \frac{\text{Graduates}}{\text{Cohort} - \text{Exclusions}^*} \right.$$

$$\text{ASR} \left\{ \frac{\text{Graduates}}{\text{Cohort} - \text{Exclusions}^* - \text{Left Eligible}} \right.$$

\* Exclusions include death, permanent disability, church mission, and military or foreign service.  
Note: Both rates use a six-year window from initial collegiate enrollment.

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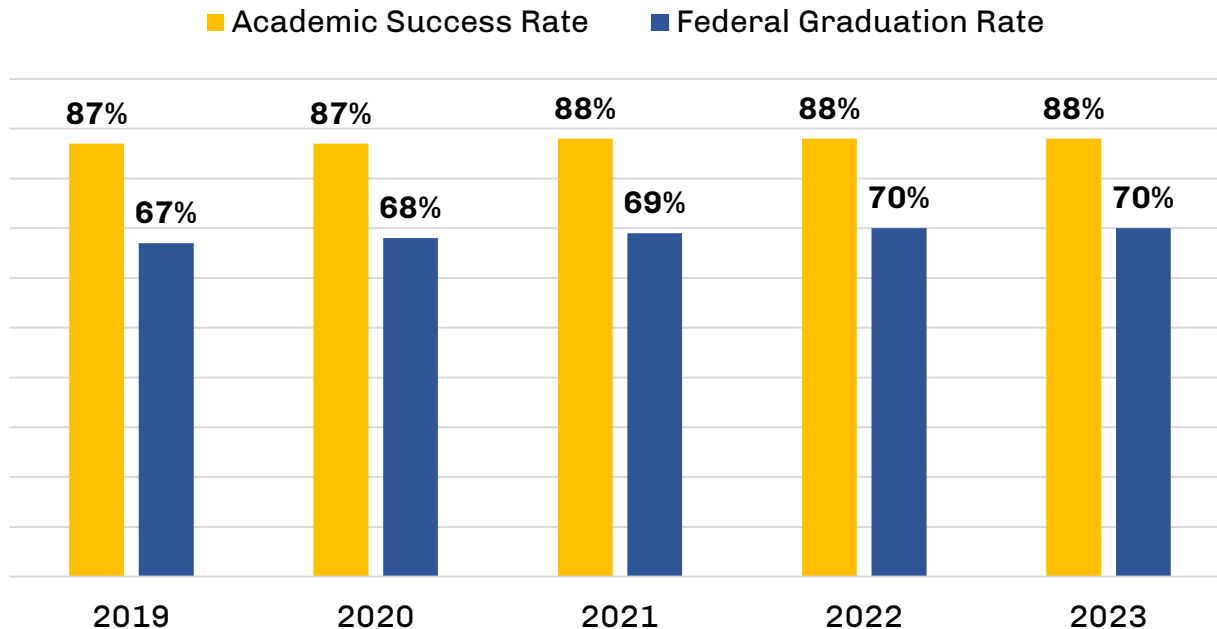
# Notes About ASR Trends

- The 2023 reporting cycle was the fourth year the federal graduation rate/ASR data submission was required for all Division III institutions.
- Data submission was voluntary for the 2017 through 2019 reporting cycles. In each of those years, more than half of Division III institutions reported. The submitted data were determined to be representative of the broader Division III membership.

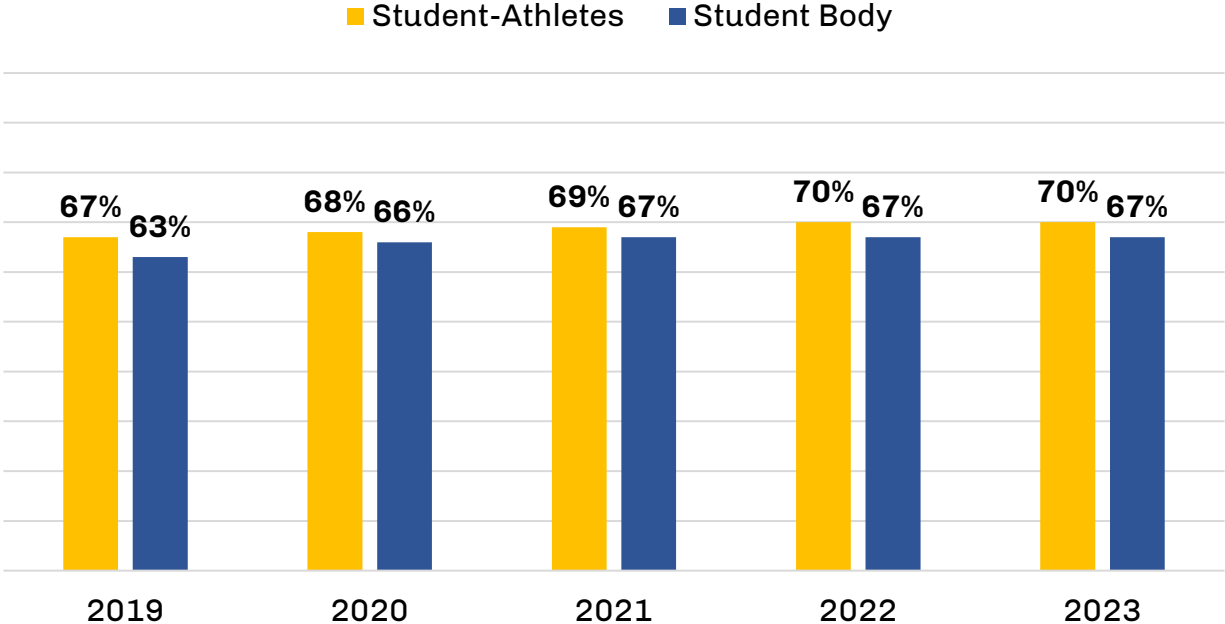
