FIVE STANDOUT STUDENT-ATHLETES HEADLINE 2025-26 MEN'S AT-LARGE ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA® TEAMS

GREENWOOD, Ind. – Five talented student-athletes highlight the 2025-26 Academic All-America® men's at-large teams selected by College Sports Communicators.

Gymnast **Asher Cohen** from the University of Nebraska, wrestler **Crew Howard** from the University of Nebraska Kearney, water polo student-athlete **Mark Addison** from Augustana College (Ill.), volleyball opposite hitter **Matt Pennala** from Saint Xavier University and baseball utility player **Madden Butler** from Itawamba Community College were named as the Academic All-America® Team Members of the Year for NCAA Divisions I, II and III, NAIA and college division, respectively.

Division I

Cohen earned his third selection to the CSC Academic All-America at-large team after claiming the 2026 NCAA championship on the rings. The Lakewood, Colorado, native was named the College Gymnastics Association Specialist of the Year after winning eight individual titles during his senior season and was selected one of 42 recipients of the NCAA's winter postgraduate scholarship. He was a three-time All-American and a team finals competitor all four years at Nebraska.

Seven members of the Academic All-America® Division I at-large teams have a perfect 4.0 grade-point average in their undergraduate or graduate work. The 17 members on the first team registered an average GPA of 3.96, with all three teams combining for a 3.84 GPA.

Ten student-athletes join Cohen as repeat selections on the Academic All-America® Division I at-large teams: **Kent Anderson** (University of Denver); **Trey Augustine** (Michigan State University); **Matt Basgall** (Michigan State University); **James Conway** (Franklin & Marshall College); **Ethan Fang** (Oklahoma State University); **Andrej Grgurevic** (University of Southern California); **Levi Haines** (Penn State University); **Mitchell Mesenbrink** (Penn State University); **Hiroshi Tai** (Georgia Institute of Technology); and **Ryan Voois** (University of Illinois).

Division II

A three-time All-American and the 2026 national runner-up at heavyweight, Howard capped his final season with a 26-3 record. The Clarinda, Iowa native was this year's NCAA Elite Scholar-Athlete Award recipient and helped the Lopers to their second-straight Division II national championship and third in the last five seasons. A four-time National Wrestling Coaches Association Scholar All-American, Howard ended his collegiate career with a 95-10 record, including 33 pins and 12 technical falls. He was a two-time finalist for the Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association's Ken B. Jones Award, which recognizes the top female and male student-athlete.

Six members of the Academic All-America® Division II at-large teams boast a perfect 4.0 GPA in their undergraduate or graduate work. The 18 members on the first team have an average GPA of 3.92, with the entire 45-man team combining for a 3.85 GPA.

Ten student-athletes were repeat selections on the Academic All-America® Division II at-large teams: **Corbin Carpenter** (University of Alaska Anchorage); **Michael Durnin** (Adelphi University); **Alex Egorshin** (University of Montevallo); **Kyle Lewis** (Adelphi University); **Brock Ollila** (Rockhurst University); **John Parker** (Newberry College); **Cooper Scheck** (Fort Hays State University); **Lukas Taggart** (Colorado School of Mines); **Cooper Tendrick** (University of West Florida); and **Cody Thompson** (Colorado School of Mines). Another student-athlete, Lee University's **Drew Zielinski**, was a first-team Academic All-America® college division honoree at Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College in 2024.

Division III

Addison led Augustana water polo to a third-place finish at the USA Water Polo Division III National Championships with an 18-9 overall record. The accounting, business analytics and business intelligence triple-major earned Association of Collegiate Water Polo Coaches All-America first-team honors and was selected as the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation East Player of the Year. He finished the 2026 season with 52 goals, 10 assists and 26 steals in 17 games. A native of Eads, Tennessee, Addison was a four-time All-Conference honoree and was named a CSC Academic All-American with the Viking swimming and diving team earlier this year.

Eight honorees on the Academic All-America® Division III at-large teams boast a perfect 4.0 GPA in their undergraduate work or graduate school. The 15-man first team has an average GPA of 3.96, with the entire 45-man team combining for a 3.87 GPA.

Nine student-athletes are repeat selections on the Academic All-America® Division III at-large teams: **Juney Bai** (Illinois Wesleyan University); **Lev BenAvram** (Brandeis University); **Eric Chen** (Haverford College); **Adam Ivatorov** (MIT); **Eric Kinkaid** (Loras College); **Thompson Lau** (Amherst College); **Jonathan McEwen** (Washington and Lee University); **Dylan Mulvaney** (Springfield College); and **David Zhang** (Carnegie Mellon University).

NAIA

An American Volleyball Coaches Association first-team All-American for the second season in a row, Pennala repeated as the NAIA team member of the year after leading Saint Xavier back to the national championship match. He became the program's first player to reach 1,000 career kills after playing and starting in 97 of 117 sets. He led the Cougars with 377 kills and a .311 attack percentage. The Long Beach, California, native added 169 digs, 63 blocks (seven solo), 41 aces and 25 assists.

Five members of the 22-man Academic All-America® NAIA at-large teams boast a perfect 4.0 GPA in their undergraduate or graduate work. The NAIA honorees combined for a 3.82 GPA.

College Division

Butler led Itawamba Community College with a .441 batting average (75-for-170) and adding 60 RBI, 12 home runs and seven stolen bases in 47 games. The Corinth, Mississippi, native was named to the All-Mississippi Association of Community Colleges Conference first team and recently committed to NCAA Division I McNeese State University.

Eight members of the Academic All-America® college division at-large teams recorded a perfect 4.0 GPA and the 20 total honorees combined for a 3.90 GPA.
