FIVE TALENTED STUDENT-ATHLETES HIGHLIGHT 2025-26 ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA® WOMEN'S AT-LARGE TEAMS

GREENWOOD, Indiana – Five standouts headline a group of outstanding student-athletes named to the 2025-26 Academic All-America® Women's At-Large teams as selected by College Sports Communicators (CSC).

Maggie Boyd from UCLA, **Katie Lange** from Grand Valley State University, **Caroline Adams** from Middlebury College, **Koral Hadac** from University of the Cumberlands and **Emma Jensen** from Northwest Mississippi Community College are the Academic All-America® Women's At-Large Team Member of the Year honorees for NCAA Division I, Division II, Division III, NAIA and the College Division, respectively.

Division I

A senior from Flower Mound, Texas, **Boyd** was named the AVCA Beach Volleyball National Player of the Year and finished her UCLA career with 125 wins. **Boyd** and her partner **Sally Perez** led the Bruins to their third NCAA Beach Volleyball championship in May. The duo clinched the title with a Court 1 victory over top-seeded Stanford.

Boyd is the seventh player in NCAA beach volleyball history to earn four first team All-American honors. She is a superstar in the classroom as well, earning second-team Academic All-America® honors and a Big Ten Distinguished Scholar Award in 2025. **Boyd** has a 3.59 GPA with her psychology major.

Six student-athletes are repeat selections on this year's team, led by Stanford University junior fencer **Arianna Cao**, who joins **Boyd** on the 2025-26 first team. **Cao** is a two-time first team Academic All-America® choice.

In addition to **Boyd** and **Cao**, other repeat selections include **Sara Rask** (Denver), **Katie Zaun** (Texas Christian), **Marg van der Wal** (Texas), and **Myrte van Herwijnen** (UMass). **Zaun** is the only three-time honoree on this year's list. A 2025-26 second team pick, she made the first team last year and the second team in 2023-24.

A total of 45 student-athletes were recognized with an aggregate 3.86 undergraduate GPA. The 15 first team members hold a 3.84 GPA. A total of 14 honorees have a perfect 4.00 GPA, including six on the first team.

Division II

A senior from Sterburn, Minnesota, **Lange** ended her GVSU career as a three-time national champion and three-time All-American. She compiled a career record of 87-8 overall. **Lange** made history by becoming the first-ever national champion in NCAA women's wrestling at the inaugural national championship meet in March.

In the classroom, **Lange** has a 4.00 GPA with her accounting major. **Lange** is one of 17 Academic All-America® honorees who have a perfect 4.00 GPA, including 10 on the first team. A total of 45 student-athletes were recognized with an aggregate 3.91 undergraduate GPA. The 15 first team members carry an amazing 3.95 GPA.

There are seven repeat selections on this year's squad, led by two-time first team Academic All-America® **Soleil Edwards**, a senior crew and rowing student-athlete from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University. Texas Woman's University senior gymnast **Kami Zarlengo** was a third team pick in 2023-24 and moved up to the first team this season.

Shippensburg University field hockey player **Emma Albee** and University of Bridgeport gymnast **Abigail Kenney** moved up the ladder one notch each, as they made the second team after landing on the third team in 2024-25.

Three lacrosse student-athletes make their second appearance by finding spots on the third team. **Sarah Cole** (Alabama-Huntsville) and **Paige Jenkins** (Slippery Rock) made the second team in 2024-25. **Jenkins**' SRU teammate **Grace Rotter** was a first team choice in 2024-25.

Division III

A senior from Norwich, Vermont, Adams graduated summa cum laude this spring with a double major in neuroscience and Spanish, compiling a 3.96 GPA. She helped Middlebury win the 2026 NCAA Division III national championship in lacrosse, the Panthers' fifth consecutive NCAA crown.

In 2026, Adams won the IWLCA National Player and Attacker of the Year awards. She was named the NCAA tournament's Most Outstanding Player and the NESCAC Offensive Player of the Year. Adams is a three-time IWLCA All-American with three regional awards as well.

Adams was named Phi Beta Kappa. A vibrant member of the Middlebury community, she served as co-leader and sustainability chair of the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee (SAAC) and as an Everybody Wins Mentor at Mary Hogan Elementary School.

Nine student-athletes make the Division III Academic All-America® at-large teams for the second time. They include **Josephine Chang** (Johns Hopkins), **Carys Code** (Emory), **Megan Goodreau** (Wisconsin-River Falls), **Jenna Halpin** (Johns Hopkins), **Hannah Jiang** (Tufts), **Jess Palmer-Sammons** (Macalester), **Nora Stepan** (Augsburg), **Lauren Sullivan** (Stevens Institute of Technology) and **Becky Williams** (DePauw).

The Division III Academic All-America® at-large teams honored 46 student-athletes with seven members of the first team holding perfect 4.00 GPAs either as an undergraduate or a graduate student. A total of 13 of the 46 members have 4.00 GPAs. The 16-member first team has a 3.93 GPA, while the entire 46-person unit has a 3.90 GPA.

The Division III Academic All-America® program is being financially supported by the NCAA Division III national governance structure to assist the CSC with handling the awards fulfillment aspects for the 2025-26 Division III Academic All-America® program.

NAIA

A graduate student from Rosemount, Minnesota, Hadac posted a 3.93 GPA as a communication arts and information technology sciences major. This year, she and second team Academic All-America® **Emma Rittman** concluded their respective Patriot careers as the first four-time All-Americans in program history.

For the second consecutive season, Hadac led the NAIA in caused turnovers. She is the Cumberland's career leader with 179 caused turnovers. A four-time first team All-Appalachian Athletic Conference choice, Hadac started every Patriot game played during her career (84-of-84).

In addition to Hadac and Rittman, five student-athletes are repeat selections on the NAIA Academic All-America® at-large teams. Two of the five played lacrosse with Hadac and Rittman. They are **Ashlee Baker** and **Anna Lobbezoo**. All total, five University of the Cumberland's lacrosse student-athletes made Academic All-America® at-large this year.

Corban junior beach volleyball player **Emma Bischoff** leads the remaining three veterans, as she joins Hadac as a two-time first team choice. The other two returnees are **Emmi Marks** (Corban) and **Cristelle Rodriguez** (Doane). A wrestling standout, Rodriguez was the 2024-25 NAIA Academic All-America® Women's At-Large Team Member of the Year.

The NAIA at-large teams honored 20 student-athletes with three members of the first team holding perfect 4.00 GPAs either as an undergraduate or a graduate student. The 10-member first team has a 3.93 GPA. The entire 20-member unit holds a 3.90 GPA.

The NAIA Academic All-America® program is being financially supported by the NAIA national governance structure to assist CSC with handling the awards fulfillment aspects for the 2025-26 NAIA Academic All-America® program.

College Division

A sophomore from Gammelby, Germany, Jensen has a 3.95 GPA with her business major. The soccer midfielder is only the second player in Northwest Mississippi CC history to earn NJCAA All-American twice. Thanks to the efforts of Jensen and her teammates, the Rangers won back-to-back NJCAA national championships.

An Oklahoma State University signee, Jensen posted 31 goals, 10 assists and 72 points as a NWCC sophomore. She scored both goals in the Rangers' 2-1 NJCAA national championship victory over Heartland Community College. Jensen set career program records in goals scored (53) and points (126).

The College Division at-large teams honored 20 student-athletes with six members of the first team holding perfect 4.00 GPAs. All total, 10 of the 20 members have 4.00 GPAs. The 10-member first team has a 3.96 GPA. The entire 20-person squad holds a 3.95 GPA.
